ORDINANCE 2023-20

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PART I I CHAPTERS 111-20.1 AND 111-28

Borough of Longport Code Provision Chapters §111-20 and §111-28 are hereby amended as follows:

§ 111-20.1 Commercial landscapers.

[Added 3-19-1997 by Ord. No. 97-09]

A. Definitions. As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meaning indicated:

COMMERCIAL LANDSCAPER

A person or entity whose business involves the placing, planting, arranging, trimming, cutting and removing of trees and the maintenance of lawns, trees, bushes, shrubs, gardens and related appurtenances on land or property for any purpose.

VEHICLE Every device in, upon or by which a person or property is or may be transported upon a highway.

- **B.** Permit application information. The application for a permit to operate or conduct business as a commercial landscaper in the Borough of Longport shall be made in writing, signed by the applicant and submitted to the Borough Construction Code Department. The application shall include the following information:
- (1) The name, address and telephone number of the applicant.
- (2) The character and type of substance, e.g., grass clipping, brush, twigs or leaves that the applicant will be dumping in his or her operation.
- (3) The location where the debris is to be taken and the name and telephone number of the company or organization to receive such debris.
- **C.** Operating requirements. Every commercial landscaper operating within the Borough of Longport shall be required to comply with the following:
- (1) The name of the landscaping company shall be clearly indicated on both sides of any vehicle used in said operation, shall be no less than three inches in height and shall include the address and telephone number.
- (2) Tags identifying that vehicles have been properly registered must be displayed on each vehicle.
- (3) The use of backpack blowers used for the purposes of spreading and blowing about grass, leaves and other debris shall be prohibited. The use of hand-held grass blowers and leaf blowers shall be permitted, subject to compliance with the following conditions:
- (a) All sidewalk clippings shall be dispersed back onto the homeowner's lawn.
- (b) All gutters shall be swept and shoveled.

- (c) Hand-held blowers shall not be used in gutters or streets.
- (d) Storm drains shall be covered while working in the immediate vicinity.
- **(e)** All leaves, twigs and clippings must be properly bagged and taken to the Atlantic County Municipal Utilities Authority plant for processing, or otherwise legally disposed of in accordance with state and local laws and other applicable regulations
- (4) All vehicles used in landscaping operations shall be required to utilize a cover on said vehicles to prevent any clipping, leaves, twigs or other debris from blowing out of the vehicle when traveling in the streets of the Borough of Longport.
- (5) Commercial landscapers shall not place clippings, twigs or leaves at the curb. This material must be properly removed by the commercial landscaper.
- (6) Commercial landscapers shall be permitted to engage in the landscaping business during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday through Friday; and 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturdays. No work shall be permitted on Sundays except as otherwise directed by the Police Department.
 - (1) [Year-round rule: Commercial Landscaping shall be permitted Monday through Friday throughout the year between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. No landscaping shall be permitted on Sundays or the following holidays: New Year's Day; Memorial Day weekend (Saturday, Sunday and Monday); July 4 (If July 4 falls on a Monday or Friday, then Saturday is also a prohibited day. If July 4 falls on a weekend then no landscaping shall be permitted on the day of observance whether the Friday before or Monday after the weekend); Labor Day weekend (Saturday, Sunday and Monday); Thanksgiving Day; Christmas Day.
 - (2) Summer Saturday Rule: Saturday landscaping shall be permitted during the period June 15 to September 15, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.
 - (3) Winter Saturday rule: Saturday landscaping shall be permitted during the period September 16 to June 14 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.,
 - (4) Emergency exception: in the case of urgent necessity in the interest of public health and safety, and then only with a permit from the Construction Code Official, which permit may be granted for a period not to exceed three days while the emergency continues and which permit may be renewed for a period of three days or less while the emergency continues or except as otherwise directed by the Police Department.]
 - (5) The use of lawnmowers, chainsaws and grass blowers powered by internal combustion engines other than during the prescribed hours shall constitute a violation of this article.

§ 111-28 Violations and penalties.

Any person violating any provision of this article shall, upon conviction in the Municipal Court of the Borough of Longport, be subject to a fine not to exceed \$200 [\$1000.00] or imprisonment in the county jail for any term not to exceed 90 days, or both, in the discretion of the Municipal Magistrate [Judge] hearing the same.

COUNTY OF ATLANTIC

ORDINANCE 2023-21

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PART I I CHAPTER 112 SECTIONS 17 AND 20

Borough of Longport Code Provision Chapter 112-17 is hereby amended as follows:

§ 112-17 Signs and posters on public structures [and property.]

No person shall post, [place] or affix any notice, poster, [sign] or other paper or device calculated to attract the attention of the public to any lamppost, utility pole or tree or upon any public structure[,] or building [or land including, but not limited to, any public right of way, park or the beach], except as may be authorized or required by law.

Borough of Longport Code Provision Chapter 112-20 is hereby amended as follows:

§ 112-20 Violations and penalties.

[Amended 4-7-1993 by Ord. No. 93-05; 10-6-2010 by Ord. No. 2010-17]

- **A.** Any person violating this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable by one or more of the following: a period of community service not exceeding 90 days; a fine of not less than \$100 [\$500.00] nor more than \$1,250 at the discretion of the presiding Judge.
- **B.** Any person who is convicted of violating the provisions of this chapter within one year of the date of the previous violation of the same chapter and who was fined for the previous violation shall be sentenced by the court to an additional fine as a repeat offender. The additional fine imposed by the court for a repeated offense shall not be less that the minimum or exceed the maximum fine fixed for a violation of this chapter, but shall be calculated separately from the fine imposed for the original violation of this chapter. Whenever such person shall have been officially notified of by service of a summons in a prosecution, or in any other official manner, that said person is committing a violation, each day's occurrence shall constitute a separate offense, punishable by a fine or penalty.

ORDINANCE 2023-22

AN ORDINANCE ADDING ARTICLE III SECTION 136-15

The Borough of Longport Code is hereby amended as follows:

[adding]

ARTICLE III

§136-15 Lead Paint Inspections Required for Certain Rental Properties

- **A.** A lead inspector designated for the Borough of Longport (Borough) shall inspect every single-family, two-family, and multiple rental dwelling located within the Borough for lead-based paint hazards through visual assessment and/or dust wipe sampling in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16 et seq., as may be amended from time to time.
- **B.** The property owner or landlord may, in lieu of having the dwelling inspected by the Borough's lead inspector, directly hire a private lead inspector who is certified to provide lead paint inspection services by the Department of Community Affairs to perform the lead-based paint inspection in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16 et seq., as may be amended from time to time.
- **C.** In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(c), a dwelling unit in a single-family, two-family, or multiple rental dwelling shall not be subject to inspection and evaluation for the presence of lead-based paint hazards if the unit:
- (1) Has been certified to be free of lead-based paint;
- (2) Was constructed during or after 1978;
- (3) Is in a multiple dwelling that has been registered with the Department of Community Affairs as a multiple dwelling for at least 10 years, either under the current or a previous owner, and has no outstanding lead violations from the most recent cyclical inspection performed on the multiple dwelling under the Hotel and Multiple Dwelling Law; [1] Editor's Note: See N.J.S.A. 55:13A-1 et seq.
- (4) Is a single-family or two-family seasonal rental dwelling which is rented for less than six months duration each year by tenants that do not have consecutive lease renewals; or (5) Has a valid lead-safe certification.
- **D.** If lead-based paint hazards are identified, then the owner of the dwelling shall remediate the hazards through abatement or lead-based paint hazard control mechanisms in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(d). Upon the remediation of the lead-based paint hazard, the Borough's lead inspector or visual assessor, as may be applicable, or

the owner's private lead inspector, shall conduct an additional inspection of the unit to certify that the hazard no longer exists.

- **E.** If no lead-based paint hazards are identified, then the Borough's lead inspector or the owner's private lead inspector shall certify the dwelling as lead safe on a form prescribed by the Department of Community Affairs, which shall be valid for two years.
- F. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(e), property owners shall:
- (1) Provide evidence of a valid lead-safe certification and the most recent tenant turnover to the Borough at the time of the cyclical inspection.
- (2) Provide evidence of a valid lead-safe certification to new tenants of the property at the time of tenant turnover and shall affix a copy of such certification as an exhibit to the tenant's or tenants' lease.
- (3) Maintain a record of the lead-safe certification which shall include the name or names of the unit's tenant or tenants if the inspection was conducted during a period of tenancy.
- **G.** The fees for a lead-based paint inspection shall be pursuant to the shared services agreement between the Borough and The Atlantic County Improvement Authority
- (1) In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(h), an additional fee of \$20 per dwelling unit inspected by the Borough's lead inspector or the owner's private lead inspector shall be assessed for the purposes of the Lead Hazard Control Assistance Actu unless the unit owner demonstrates that the Department of Community Affairs has already assessed an additional inspection fee of \$20. The fees collected pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited into the Lead Hazard Control Assistance Fund.

A Resolution Denouncing Antisemitism and Calling for Healing and Education

WHEREAS, antisemitism, including harassment on the basis of actual or perceived Jewish origin, ancestry, ethnicity, identify, affiliation, or faith, remains a persistent, pervasive, and disturbing problem in American society; and

WHEREAS, Jews continue to be a targeted minority in the United States and are consistently the most likely of all religious groups to be victimized by incidents of hate, and such incidents are increasing at an alarming rate; and

WHEREAS, we acknowledge that following the attacks on the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh, the Chabad of Poway in San Diego, a Kosher supermarket in Jersey City and a Chanukah gathering in Monsey, synagogues have felt compelled to re-evaluate their own security measures to keep their congregations safe; and WHEREAS, the recent AJC (American Jewish Committee) State of Antisemitism in America Report found that more than one in three American Jews (37%) say they have been victims of antisemitism over the past five years; and WHEREAS, the attack on a kosher deli in Jersey City in 2019 resulted in the murder of three people and the antisemitic verbal assaults in New Jersey have disturbed our communities and must be taken as an opportunity to teach about this issue and seek paths for healing and eliminating such hate; and WHEREAS, officials and institutions throughout the state have a responsibility to protect citizens from acts of hate and bigotry, including antisemitism, and must be given the tools to do so; and

WHEREAS, valid monitoring, informed analysis and investigation, and effective policy-making all benefit from accurate and uniform definitions; and WHEREAS, the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA), by consensus vote of its member states, adopted a Working Definition of Antisemitism in May 2016, which has become the internationally recognized, authoritative definition of antisemitism for use by governments and international organizations; and

WHEREAS, the Working Definition adopted by the IHRA reads in full: "Antisemitism is a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred toward Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of antisemitism are directed toward Jewish or non-Jewish individuals and/or their property, toward Jewish community institutions and religious facilities."; and WHEREAS, the IHRA Working Definition has proven to be an essential tool used to help determine contemporary manifestations of antisemitism; and

WHEREAS, in the United States, the IHRA Working Definition is utilized by various government agencies, including the U.S. Department of State and the U.S. Department of Education, and can be utilized by law enforcement agencies in monitoring, training, and education.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the New Jersey State League of Municipalities, in conference assembled, denounces antisemitism in all forms and calls for healing and education; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism should be made available as an educational resource for municipalities to address antisemitism and other forms of discrimination; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be forwarded to our representatives in Congress, the members of the New Jersey General Assembly and the State Senate, the New Jersey State Attorney General, the Lieutenant Governor and the Governor of the State of New Jersey.
